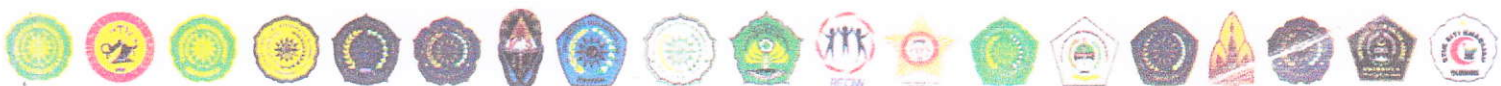

Introduction: Many factors trigger a lonesome among the elders in nursing homes. Being apart from the family is one of them. They could not feel the together living in home with their relatives and children. The objective of the study was to find out the factors making the older people in nursing home feel lonely, especially those live in a unit of social rehabilitation of DewanataCilacap.

Method: This applied a cross-sectional design. The population was all elders in the nursing home. There were 90 persons. The sampling used was purposive sampling. The analysis used chi-square and logistic regression.

Results: The age of the respondents ranged from 60-70 years old (36, 80%), 71-80 years old (9, 20%). The male was 13 (28,9%), and the female was 32 (71,1%). There is a relation between the factors of psychology (p value= 0,022, OR = 6,30), spirituality (p value = 0,003, OR = 11,28), and sex (p value = 0,004, OR = 8,64)to the loneliness among the elders. The peer support do not contribute to the loneliness as it (p value = 0,072). Psychology is the dominant factor influencing the loneliness among the elders.

Conclusion: There is a relation of psychological, spirituality, and sex factors to the loneliness among the elders, andpsychology is the strongest factor to trigger the loneliness among them.

Introduction: Suicide is considered as a conscious of a person to end her or his life. Suicidal behavior is a deliberate act to kill her or himself. Suicide involves an ambivalence between the desire to live and wanting to die. Suicidal behavior consists of three tiers in the form of ideas / cues suicide, self unuh threats, and suicide attempts. Someone at risk of suicide is when they are not able to get the solution of problems and suffering. The purpose of writing this scientific paper was to describe the result of specialized case Stuart's Stress Adaptation and Eakes's Chronic Sorrow Theories in Marzuki Mahdi Hospital.

Methods: The Nursing interventions were provided to 11 clients using cognitive therapy. **Results:** The cognitive therapy provided to the clients showed the improvement in the prevention of suicidal behavior.

Conclusions: The cognitive therapy has demonstrated the effectiveness of positive thinking ability of the clients.It is recommended that the suicidal risk clients can be treated with cognitive therapy using the combination of the Stuart'Stress Adaptation and Eakes' Chronic Sorrow Theories, as well as the combination of other therapies to be complemented to each other.

AIC-HHC 2013 : Humanized Care For Smoking Cessation Among Adolescents In Secondary School

Introduction: Tobacco use is a major cause of preventable disease and premature death. Currently the smoking prevalent rate is dramatically decreased in Thailand but it is increasing among adolescents. This report is part of participatory research (PAR) which aimed to explain the effectiveness of a school intervention programme, "Let's quit smoking in 5 days". This programme aimed to empower high school students to participate in a smoking cessation in order to quit or decrease smoking.

Methods: A total of 55 volunteer-smoked students in one secondary school were participated in the smoking cessation program. The program was composed of watching VCD to promote dangerous recognition and quit smoking motivation. Story of VCD was focused on son's quit smoking by socialization through father's suffering experiences from lung cancer.

Results: After VCD watching, students were motivated from significant persons such as friends, teachers continuously, and were relaxed through music appreciation, sport, more water and fruit juice drinking, bathing, and praying meditation. Then students were asked to report themselves with their buddies and teacher and were provides effective counseling from nurse. It was found that 20 students could stop smoking in 1 month, and the rest of students could reduce smoking. The students got highest level of satisfaction about more knowledge (58 %), knew how to quit smoking (56 %), had new skills about quitting smoking (58 %), gained more self confident to quit smoking (64%), gained more trust from their loved one such as parents and friends (64%). In addition, students transformed to be change agent and support their friends in running a school-based smoking cessation program.

Conclusion: There were evidence that student volunteers had become effective motivators for smoking cessation, a supporting network for students who want to quit smoking, and being the counselors for others. This help to project sustainability contribution.
