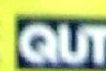

Dear Colleagues and friends,

Safety is an issue that became focus of the world attention both in health care and social life. In healthcare facilities, safety is an important indicator in determining the quality of health services. Various studies have been conducted around the world related to the patient safety incidents. Institute of Medicine has published a report that approximately 44,000 to 98,000 deaths occur each year in health care in the United States. This amount exceeds deaths from traffic accidents, breast cancer, and AIDS (Kohn, Janet, and Molla, 2000). World Health Organization (WHO, 2004) also reported that the prevalence of patient safety incidents in various countries such as Australia, England, New Zealand and Europe are still high, ranging from 4-16.6 percent annually.

Each individual involved in health care have a responsibility for the safety of themselves, others, and the environment. As a system, every component in an interdependent health care (interdependence) and connected (interrelationships). Multidisciplinary effort is also needed to address safety issues, especially environmental emergency and disaster preparedness. WHO (2007) present strategies and preparation of disaster risk reduction is a national responsibility of the entire line, from the level of the Ministry of Health, Red Cross, social agencies of health, health care facilities, to healthcare professionals. In addition, emergency preparedness also requires a multi sectorial approach. At the national level, the provision of health services is highly dependent on legal preparedness, transport and communications, water and electrical services, public works, a team of search and rescue (SAR), and social services. at the international level, efforts can be made through the WHO cooperation with other international organizations so as to help the governments of the countries affected by disasters and emergencies.

Academic Faculty of Nursing, University of Indonesia recognizes the importance of scientific meetings that support the growth and development of multidisciplinary science to improve patient safety, healthcare workers, and the environment. For those reasons, FON conducted the International Nursing Conference in Bali 24-26 October 2013.
